

Pre-Med & Pre-Health Summer Opportunities

Before applying to a summer program:

- Check the dates of the program. Some summer programs may begin before the Northwestern Spring Quarter ends. Some programs may be flexible with start dates, but it's best to check before applying.
- Check the eligibility requirements. Some summer programs may limit their applicant pool based on particular factors (e.g., state of residence, grade level, disadvantaged educational/economic background). Don't waste your time applying to a program that isn't a good match.
- **Proofread all components of your application.** You want to make sure all of your materials are polished and professional.
